The models we fly are small indoor aircraft weighing just a few grams to much larger outdoor scale models you can see at our field regularly. Getting started is as simple as speaking to one of our members who will guide you through the process of becoming involved. In 2001 we applied for, and obtained, permission from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation and the Town of Clarkstown to go ahead with our plans for the construction of a model

All Clarkstown Residents are always welcome at the field and also at Congers Lake where we enjoy flying our float planes and radio controlled boats.
